### 1) Barring (Preposition) – के सिवाय

**Meaning:** except for; if not for.

**Synonyms:** with the exception of, excepting

**Antonyms:** including, inclusive of, plus

**Usage:** "barring accidents, we should win"

### 2) Lauded (Verb) – प्रशंसा करना

**Meaning:** praise (a person or their achievements) highly.

**Synonyms:** praise, extol, hail

**Antonyms:** condemn, criticize

**Usage:** "the obituary lauded him as a great statesman and soldier"

---

### 3) Inevitable (Adjective) – अवश्यभावी

**Meaning:** certain to happen; unavoidable.

**Synonyms:** unavoidable, inescapable

**Antonyms:** avoidable, uncertain

**Usage:** "war was inevitable"

---

### 4) Adjourn (Verb) – स्थगित करना

**Meaning:** go somewhere for rest or refreshment.

**Synonyms:** withdraw, retire, retreat

**Antonyms:** assemble, continue

**Usage:** "they adjourned to a local pub"

---

### 5) Perished (Verb) – नाश होना

**Meaning:** die, especially in a violent or sudden way.

**Synonyms:** die, lose one's life

**Antonyms:** fresh, alive

**Usage:** "a great part of his army perished of hunger and disease"

---

### 6) Expatriate (Adjective) – देशनिष्कासिती

**Meaning:** denoting or relating to a person living outside their native country.

**Synonyms:** emigrant, living abroad

**Antonyms:** native, indigenous

**Usage:** "expatriate workers"

### 7) Unprecedented (Adjective) – अभूतपूर्व

**Meaning:** never done or known before.

**Synonyms:** unparalleled, unequalled, unmatched

**Antonyms:** normal, common

**Usage:** “the government took the unprecedented step of releasing confidential correspondence”

### 8) Rampant (Adjective) – अनियंत्रित

**Meaning:** flourishing or spreading unchecked.

**Synonyms:** uncontrolled, unrestrained, unchecked

**Antonyms:** controlled, under control

**Usage:** “political violence was rampant”

---

### 9) Populous (Adjective) – जनपूर्ण

**Meaning:** having a large population; densely populated.

**Synonyms:** crowded, congested, packed

**Antonyms:** uninhabited, deserted

**Usage:** “the populous city of Shanghai”

---

### 10) Dismal (Adjective) – निराशाजनक

**Meaning:** causing a mood of gloom or depression.

**Synonyms:** dingy, dim, dark

**Antonyms:** bright, cheerful

**Usage:** “the dismal weather made the late afternoon seem like evening”
