5) Perished (Verb) - नाश होना

Meaning: die, especially in a violent or sudden way.

Synonyms: die, lose one's life

Antonyms: fresh, alive

Usage: "a great part of his army perished of hunger and disease"

6) Expatriate (Adjective) - देशनिष्कासिती

Meaning: denoting or relating to a person living outside their native country.

Synonyms: emigrant, living abroad **Antonyms**: native, indigenous **Usage**: "expatriate workers"
